The sustained generosity of many people who through bequests, legacies and donations provided the great part of the financial resources which made the work of the A.I.M. possible,

The contributions of Governments, both State and Federal, especially in more recent times in providing financial resources for the services of the A.I.M.,

The inventive genius of those who created the pedal radio, the flying doctor service, the community health services, the educational ventures and the many other innovative enterprises which mark the 65 years of A.L.M. history, The Very Rev. Fred McKay and his wife Margaret who both individually

The Very Rev. Fred McKay and his wife Margaret who both individually and together worked firstly as patrol padre and nursing sister and subsequently as Superintendent and wife from 1951-73,

The work of the Church in united action with other denominations which has always marked the mission of the A.I.M. and in particular, the creation and development of the United Church in North Australia and the founding of St. Philip's College, Alice Springs, The people of the inland to whom the A.I.M. came and who received

Max Griffiths who as the third Superintendent of the Australian Inland Mission from 1974 to 1977 has led the A.I.M. into many new ventures and areas of service,

I crave leave to Affirm that on 22nd day of June, 1977, a section of this Church will be uniting with the Methodist and Congregational Churches to form The Uniting Church in Australia, On that day such a union takes effect by virtue of legislation now duly enacted.

Such legislation preserves the statutory right of Presbyterians not concurring in the decision to unite of the Thirty-Fifth General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church of Australia, to remain members of the Presbyterian Church of Australia continuing to function under the Scheme of Union of 24th July, 1901, as amended, its existing Constitution and existing Acts of Parliament.

It is therefore lawful for us who remain within the Presbyterian Church of Australia to adopt such measures as are competent to us for the continuance of our Church and for this purpose to meet in this place on Thursday, 23rd day of June, 1977, at the hour of 10 a.m. 1 therefore invite all those who adhere to this affirmation to remain with me

in this place upon the completion today of the business of this Assembly.

The motion was seconded and approved.

The Moderator conveyed the good wishes of the Assembly to those who will enter the Presbyterian Church of Australia, continuing to function upon the inauguration of the Uniting Church in Australia.

The Rev. K. J. Gardner conveyed reciprocal good wishes to those members of the Assembly who will enter the Uniting Church in Australia.

34. The House sat in private (Min. 36).

The motion was seconded and approved.

41, A Communication from the Very Reverend N. Faichney re Conversations with representatives of the Episcopal Conference of the Roman Catholic Church was laid on the table and received.

That the Assembly appoint the Moderator, Clerks and Business Committee a Commission to scrutinise and correct the Minutes, The motion was seconded and approved.

43. The business of the Assembly having been completed the Moderator after briefly addressing the House dissolved the Assembly in terms of Minute 43:1 (a) and (b) of the thirty-fifth General Assembly with praise, prayer and the pronouncing of the Benediction.

ADDENDA TO THE MINUTES

1. REPORTS

The Reports of the 36th General Assembly were approved with the following corrections and alterations.

Ecumenical Mission and Relations:

Par. 9 "In the New Hebrides".

In line 2 delete 1947 and insert 1948.

Par. 48. Add a new paragraph 48 as follows and re-number subsequent paragraphs.

48. In 1974 the Board appointed the Rev. R. F. Wootton to work at justice and development issues. Human rights are as basic to the Gospel as the command to love our neighbour as ourselves, and as deep a part of our Judaeo/Christian traditions as the Exodus. We confess a Lord who goes before and with us into the depths of suffering and whose resurrection empowers us to costly obedience and hope. Contending with principalities and powers calls for us to understand well the dynamics of power and powerlessness at all levels.

Human rights begin with the right to live, and this right is systematically denied to many people in the world, especially peasants, outcast and minority peoples and many unemployed. Those who assert their human dignity against the forces that deprive them are subjected to political deprivation, detention without trial, and torture. Labour movements are suppressed. Legal systems are manipulated. Women suffer the greatest denials.

The denial of the basic need of adequate food for millions is the most serious violation of human rights in Asia.

The problem of political detainees continues to increase. Arbitrary arrest and imprisonment without trial or charges, trials with fabricated charges, etc., are common throughout the region as well as in other parts of the world. Militarization uses up a vast proportion of the world's resources of people,

money and metals. The amount of money spent on militarization could readily feed, clothe, house and employ the unemployed. The sufferings caused by militarization, and the threat which it presents to continued life, demand that Christians support moves for demilitarization.

The Board has made a small beginning at raising issues of injustice, oppression, discrimination against and exploitation of minorities through national and multi-national systems. We have begun to link groups of people and individuals here with groups throughout Asia and the Pacific who are struggling for release

from various forms of oppression. We have begun to make members of the Churches aware of an involvement in the international systems that hold people bound, and to assist them to struggle for change.

Par, "Thanks" add the paragraph, "The Board acknowledges the specific gifts and creative insights brought to its work by the Superintendent, Rev. John Brown, particularly in leading the Australian Church into a deeper understanding of partnership in mission."

Reception of Ministers:

Line 14 delete "Korea" and insert "New Hebrides, and R. T. Kim from the Presbyterian Church of Korea".
